ICD-10 Facts

- National impact, mandatory for all HIPAA-covered entities
 - Entities include: hospitals, physicians and other practitioners, health insurers, 3rd party payers, electronic transmission firms, etc.
- New ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS code sets
 - Replaces ICD-9-CM (Volumes 1, 2, and 3)
 - ICD-10 has no direct impact on Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) and Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS)

ICD-10 Facts

- For dates of services rendered on or after October 1, 2014
 - All claims must use ICD-10 codes
 - All claims using ICD-9 codes will NOT be accepted
- For dates of services rendered before October 1, 2014
 - All claims must use ICD-9 codes
- **Systems must accommodate BOTH ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes**
 - Effective with the October 1, 2014 compliance date
- **Significant Code Increase from ICD-9**
 - *Increasing from 13,000 to approximately 68,000 ICD-10-CM codes*
 - *Increasing from 3,000 to approximately 87,000 ICD-10-PCS codes*
 - *ICD-10 has more than nine times the codes in ICD-9*

Why ICD-10 Matters

- ICD-10 **advances health care** and the implementation of eHealth initiatives
- ICD-10 **captures advances in medicine** and medical technology
- ICD-10 **improves data** for quality reporting
- ICD-10 **improves public health** research, reporting and surveillance

Resource Review: Additional Resources

- ICD-10 Code Translator

- The ICD-10 code online translator tool allows you to compare many ICD-9 to ICD-10 codes.
- Keep in mind that while many codes in ICD-9-CM map directly to codes in ICD-10, in some cases, a clinical analysis may be required to determine which code or codes should be selected for your mapping.
- **The most accurate coding is accomplished using the ICD-10 coding manuals.**

ICD-10 Resource Facts

- **General Equivalence Mapping (GEMs)**
 - The GEMs are a crosswalk tool developed by CMS and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for use by all providers, payers, and data users. The mappings are free of charge and are in the public domain.
 - To obtain additional ICD-10-CM/PCS information, including the GEMs and educational resources, visit <http://www.cms.gov/ICD10> on the CMS website.
- **Mapping**
 - Mapping is not the same as coding:
 - Mapping links concepts in two code sets without consideration of patient medical record information; and
 - Coding involves the assignment of the most appropriate code based on medical record documentation and applicable coding rules/guidelines.

ICD-10 Resource Facts

- **ICD-10 Coding Book**
 - The ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS code books are already available and are a manageable size (one publisher's book is two inches thick). The use of ICD-10-CM/PCS is not predicated on the use of electronic hardware and software on the CMS website.
 - DCH does not make any recommendations on what books to use.

ICD-10 Resource Facts

- **Additional Facts**

- The **development** of ICD-10-CM/PCS involved significant clinical input. A number of medical specialty societies contributed to the development of the coding systems.
- As with ICD-9-CM, ICD-10-CM/PCS codes should be **based** on medical record documentation. While documentation supporting accurate and specific codes will result in higher-quality data, nonspecific codes are still available for use when documentation doesn't support a higher level of specificity.
