Rural Health Clinics Programs and Services Georgia Department of Community Health

A permanent or mobile clinic which is located in a rural area which provides diagnostic and therapeutic services and supplies that are commonly furnished in a physician's office or at the entry point into the health care delivery system. The clinic chooses to participate in the federal reimbursement program.

Exemptions:

No applicable. Voluntary program.

Type Regulation:

 No separate state program license is required other than those as required for individual professional practitioners. This is a voluntary federal program that allows such clinics to participate in the Medicare program.

 No separate programmatic rules. Individual professional practitioners are required to comply with state regulation re: practice of their professions.
