



## **PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES**

Pursuant to the Georgia Administrative Procedures Act, Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A.) § 50-13-1 et seq., the Georgia Department of Community Health is required to provide public notice of its intent to adopt, amend, or repeal certain rules other than interpretive rules or general statements of policy. Accordingly, the Department hereby provides notice of its intent to revise its rules and regulations, specifically Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. r. 111-8-13-.05, Appeals of Ineligibility Determinations. This is an amendment to existing rule Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. r. 111-8-13-.05 regarding an applicant's or employee's right to appeal a determination of employment ineligibility by the Department. The Georgia Caregiver Registry enables employers who are family members or guardians of elderly persons in Georgia to obtain an employment eligibility determination for applicants or employees who are providing personal care services to the employer's family members or wards. The amendment updates and makes reference to the Department's new mailing address and makes reference to an online administrative form through which the applicant or employee may utilize to file an appeal. An exact copy of the revised rules and a synopsis of the revisions are attached to this public notice.



**SYNOPSIS OF PROPOSED RULES**

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** The Georgia Department of Community Health proposes to amend and update Rules and Regulations for the Georgia Caregiver Registry, Appeals of Ineligibility Determinations, Ga. Comp. Rules & Regs., r. 111-8-13-.05. This rule is being proposed pursuant to the authority granted the Department of Community Health in O.C.G.A. §§ 31-7-360 and 31-7-384.

**MAIN FEATURE OF THE PROPOSED RULE:** This is an amendment to existing rule Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. r. 111-8-13-.05 regarding an applicant's or employee's right to appeal a determination of employment ineligibility by the Department. The Georgia Caregiver Registry enables employers who are family members or guardians of elderly persons in Georgia to obtain an employment eligibility determination for applicants or employees who are providing personal care services to the employer's family members or wards. The amendment updates and makes reference to the Department's new mailing address and makes reference to an online administrative form through which the applicant or employee may utilize to file an appeal.

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**111-8-13-.05 Appeals of Ineligibility Determinations**

**111-8-13-.05 Appeals of Ineligibility Determinations**

(1) If an applicant or employee receives an ineligible determination notice by the Department and wishes to appeal the ineligible determination, the applicant or employee must appeal by requesting an appeal in writing within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice. The applicant or employee must submit their request in writing for the Department ~~at 2 Peachtree St., N.W., 5<sup>th</sup> Floor, Atlanta, Georgia 30303~~ via submission of the Request for Administrative Appeal form located at the Department's website at <https://dch.georgia.gov/divisionsoffices/hfrd/facility-licensure/georgia-criminal-history-check-system-gchexs/request> (or such other location as indicated on the Department's webpage) or via mail to the Georgia Department of Community Health, Office of Inspector General, 19<sup>th</sup> Floor, 2 M.L.K. Jr. Drive, SW, Atlanta, GA 30334, or such other mailing address listed for the Department's headquarters as set forth on its website located at [www.dch.ga.gov](http://www.dch.ga.gov).

(2) An applicant or employee who receives an ineligible determination or whose name appears on a registry check conducted pursuant to these rules shall be eligible to appeal such determination pursuant to Chapter 13 of Title 50, the "Georgia Administrative Procedure Act." In a hearing held pursuant to this paragraph, the hearing officer shall consider in mitigation the length of time since the crime was committed, the absence of additional criminal charges, the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, and other indicia or rehabilitation.
