



## Request for Nominations to the Medical Care Advisory Committee

The Department of Community Health is currently seeking candidates to serve on the Medical Care Advisory Committee (MCAC). Nominations are sought from current committee members, members of the Drug Utilization Review Board (DURB), professional colleagues, and professional organizations. The MCAC is an interdisciplinary advisory committee to the Division of Medical Assistance Plans Medicaid Director, and provides guidance and expertise for Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids® policy reviews and decisions. Committee members serve a three-year term, with a maximum of six consecutive years of service.

### Committee Member Candidate Profile

Candidates for the Medical Care Advisory Committee may come from any of the following professions:

- Physicians
- Dentists
- Pharmacists
- Consumers/advocates

Candidates from any medical profession must meet the following qualifications:

- Hold an active professional license to practice in Georgia
- Actively participate as an enrolled provider in Medicaid and/or PeachCare for Kids® in good standing
- Participate in their professional associations, where applicable

Consumer/advocate candidates should be able to provide the following to committee members:

- Awareness and knowledge of gaps and barriers in service areas as well as special problems confronting the population seeking sufficient access to healthcare
- Awareness of community needs for which programs can be developed and improved
- Ability to communicate and share information to other users of Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids® services

### Primary Duties

The primary duties of Medical Care Advisory Committee members are:

- Conferring with providers, advocates, interest groups, and others as necessary to explore Medicaid-related issues
- Bringing pertinent information to the attention of the Medical Care Advisory Committee
- Attending meetings of the Medical Care Advisory Committee

### Time Commitment

The Medical Care Advisory Committee meets quarterly at the Department of Community Health in Atlanta. The meetings occur during the months of February, May, August, and November of each year.
