MFP Sentinel Event Definition

- A Sentinel Event is an unexpected occurrence involving death or serious physical or psychological injury, or the risk thereof. Serious injury specifically includes loss of limb function. The phrase, “or the risk thereof” includes any process variation for which a recurrence would carry a significant chance of a serious adverse outcome.




Types of MFP Sentinel Events

- Neglect
- Hospitalizations
- Emergency Room Visits
- Police Involvement
- Deaths



First Quarter Sentinel Events CY 2014

January 2014 thru March 2014



- 74 total Sentinel Events reported-
- 2 participants were reported being neglected
- 31 participants were reported to have been hospitalized/readmitted back into the hospital
- 28 participants were reported to have had ER visits
- 4 participants were reported having police involvement
- 7 participants deaths were reported

Summary of Analysis



An in-depth analysis was done to:

- determine the type of events that are most frequent
- determine what can be done to prevent an event from occurring and re-occurring
- assure that DCH/MFP is notified and aware of Sentinel Events
- ensure that participants' health and welfare are safeguarded and monitored
- review the appropriateness and timeliness of the follow-up and corrective actions taken
- to evaluate the follow-up and corrective actions for effectiveness
