

Birthing Centers are free-standing facilities where human births occur regularly.

Exemptions:

- Licensed hospitals
- Any birthing center operated by the federal government

Type Regulation:

A center must first obtain a certificate of need before being eligible to become permitted.

Legal Authority:

O.C.G.A. § 31-6-40 Certificate of need required for new institutional health services; exemption
